Description:

Hosting the ‘Southernmost Point of Mainland Britain’, The Lizard Village is surrounded on three sides by beautiful coastline. This Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, sited on Serpentine rock, is known for rare plants and species and sees a huge influx of tourists in the summer months.

A hub of public footpaths and coastal walks radiate from the centre of The Lizard Village, and these are popular with many thousands of visitors, and locals throughout the year, with winter temperatures being higher, and daylight hours longer than much of Mainland Britain.

It is also home throughout the year to around 1000 residents of a wide age range. There is a vibrant primary school. The nearest town is Helston – some 10 miles to the North, with the city of Truro being over 25 miles distant.

Background and context

The existing playground was completed some 10 years ago and pea gravel installed. Over the years this has met the required safety standards, however it is not ideal for young children nor for access by wheelchairs and pushchairs.

The plan is for this popular play facility to be accessible for all, with a modern smooth surface.
